A small, spreading shrub found in box-type, open forests. This species needs very well-drained soils and will grow in dappled shade, partial or full-sun. Flowers are creamy-yellow and profuse. Will withstand frost and extended dry periods. 1-2m x 2-3m. SG.

Acacia boormanii

Acacia aspera

Snowy River Wattle An adaptable and spectacular shrub, tolerating most well-drained soils and a wide range of climatic conditions. Will withstand extended wet periods. Best grown in partial or full-sun. An ornamental that can also be used as a windbreak and screening plant. This plant is

An adaptable and spectacular shrub, tolerating most well-drained soils and a wide range of climatic conditions. Will withstand extended wet periods. Best grown in partial or full-sun. An ornamental that can also be used as a windbreak and screening plant. Does not sucker. 3m x 5m. SG.

Acacia buxifolia

Box-leafed Wattle

Medium shrub with erect stems with profuse, golden-vellow flowers. An ornamental plant which will grow in most well-drained soils. Suited to partial or full-sun. Frost tolerant. 2-4m x 2-3m. SG

Acacia cognata

River Wattle

A graceful shrub with a pendulous habit. Prefers moist, light-to-heavy soils and dappled to partial-sun, but will tolerate full-sun. Will respond well to extra watering in dry periods. Frost tolerant. 4-10m x 4-6m. SG.

Acacia dealbata

Silver Wattle

An erect, small-to-tall tree with bright yellow flowers. An ornamental plant which prefers moist soil and partial or full-sun. This quickgrowing tree is suitable for windbreaks and to control gully erosion. This plant attracts many birds. 6-30m x 5-10m. SG.

Acacia doratoxylon

Currawang Requires well-drained soil and will grow on stony ridges. It is suited to dappled shade, partial or full-sun, and is both drought resistant and frost tolerant. A brightly flowered tree that is useful for gardens, parks, windbreaks, farms and roadside planting. 3-8m. SG.

Acacia genistifolia

Spreading Wattle

An ornamental species that tolerates a very wide range of soils. Withstands both extended wet and dry periods. Frost hardy. Will grow in dappled shade, partial or full-sun. Very useful as a refuge for small birds due to its prickly nature. This plant has bold, pale vellow flowers. 1-3m x 1-3m. SG.

Acacia howittii

Sticky Wattle

A graceful, erect to spreading tall shrub or small tree. Does well in moist, well-drained, light-to-heavy soils and can withstand short periods of dryness. Frost tolerant. Will grow in dappled-shade, partial or full-sun. Useful as a windbreak. 4-8m x 3-6m. SG.

Acacia implexa

Liahtwood

An upright-to-spreading tall shrub-or-small tree with pale vellow pods. A very hardy and long-lived species which requires well-drained soils and prefers partial or full-sun. Frost tolerant. Useful for shade and as a windbreak. Good furniture timber. 5-15m x 4-10m. SG.

Acacia iteaphylla

Flinders Range Wattle

A dense, spreading, medium-to-tall shrub with pale, yellow flowers. Very adaptable and grows best in well-drained, light-to-heavy soil. Prefers partial or full-sun and is drought resistant. There are many forms with different foliage. Some are pendulous, others more upright. 3-5m x 3-6m. SG.

Acacia melanoxvlon

Blackwood

Densely foliaged large shrub-to-tall tree with cream to pale vellow flower heads. Grows best in moist well-drained soils with cool climate conditions. Will withstand dappled-shade through to full-sun. Frost tolerant. Excellent furniture timber. Long living. 5-30m x 4-15m. SG.

Acacia montana

Dense, spreading, medium shrub with bright yellow flower heads. Grows well in well-drained, light-to-heavy soil in partial or full-sun. A very hardy plant suitable for hot, dry conditions. Frost hardy. 2-4m x 2-5m. SG.

Kangaroo Thorn

An extremely hardy wattle. Drought and frost tolerant. Grows in a wide range of soils and will tolerate temporary inundation. Its prickly habit makes it an excellent refuge for native birds. The flowers are golden yellow making the plant very showy. 2-4m x 2-5m. SG.

Acacia pendula

<u>Acacia par</u>adoxa

Weeping Myall

An ornamental, bushy tree that is suitable for shade and shelter planting on farms. Stock will eat the foliage. Timber is attractive and pleasantly fragrant. Frost resistant. 6-12m x 6-8m. SG.

Acacia pravissima

Ovens Wattle Very hardy small tree-to-large shrub. Widely cultivated and adaptable to a wide range of conditions. Frost and drought hardy. Suitable for screening and windbreaks. It has bright yellow, scented flowers and bluish triangular foliage. Flowers in September/October. 4-8m x 4-8m. SG.

Acacia pycnantha

Golden Wattle

Widely cultivated species that is Australia's national emblem. Very hardy, will grow in most soils with good drainage in full-sun to semishade. Useful for windbreaks and soil erosion. Golden yellow globular flowers in July - October. Reasonably frost and drought tolerant. <u>3-10m x 2-6m. SG.</u>

Acacia rubida

Red-stem Wattle

This shrub is very hardy and adaptable and will grow in most soils, in dappled shade, partial or full-sun. Frost and drought hardy. Can withstand waterlogging. Useful for windbreaks or parks. The red branches compliment the profuse, bright yellow flowers. <u>3-12m x 3-6m. SĞ.</u>

Acacia spectabilis

Mudgee Wattle

This is a very attractive wattle, with golden yellow flowers and attractive weeping branches. A good garden plant. Will grow in sandyto-heavy soils. Drought and frost resistant, but can be affected by poor drainage. 3-5m x 3-6m. SG.

Acacia verniciflua

shade or full sun. Can be used as a low windbreak. Frost tolerant. Showy, yellow flowers and pendulous branches.

3-5m x 3-5m. SG.

Acacia vestita

A widely cultivated shrub, suited to most areas. Drought and frost tolerant. Useful as a low windbreak, shelter or screen plant. Golden, yellow flowers in September to October. Frost hardy. **3-6m x 3-8m. SG.**

Allocasuarina littoralis

Slender or spreading small tree that may take on a dark brown or reddish appearance. Mature trees have deeply furrowed dark bark. Excellent timber tree. This fast-growing tree needs good drainage. Tolerates light to medium frosts and extended dry periods. 4-8m x 4-6m. SG.

Allocasuarina luehmannii

Tree that grows in a range of conditions. Useful as a windbreak and for specialty timber production. It has deeply furrowed, dark bark and fine, needle-like foliage. Will grow around the edge of swamps and tolerates temporary inundation. Frost resistant. 8-25m x 8-15m. SG.

Allocasuarina verticillata

Drooping She-oak

Wide-spread tree that will tolerate many conditions and is most suitable for salt-affected sites. Popularly grown as a shade, shelter or ornamental tree. It is useful for specialty timber and as fodder for cattle. Frost and drought hardy. 4-11m x 3-6m. SG.

Alyogyne huegelii

West Coast Gem. Native Hibiscus. A small shrub that produces abundant lilac flowers. Prefers a well-drained, sunny spot and can be pruned to improve shape. Will tolerate only mild frosts. 2.5m x 2.5m. CG.

Anigozanthus flavidus

<u>Kangaroo Paw</u> A vigorous, clumping perennial which is adaptable to most soil types. It as green, yellow or red flowers. Grows best in full-sun. Attracts bird life and makes excellent cut flowers. Suitable as a garden specimen. Can be susceptible to moderate-to-heavy frost. 0.5 -1.5m x 1-2m. SG.

Anigozanthus flavidus – Red Flower. Kangaroo Paw SG.

Arthropodium strictum

Chocolate Lily

A long-lived perennial herb with blue-to-violet flowers (rarely white) in September through to December. Likes well-drained to heavy soils. Distributed throughout Australia in grassland and woodland. This species has a delightful perfume of chocolate when flowering on a warm summer's day. Frost hardy. 20cm x 20-80cm. SG.

Atriplex nummularia

Old Man Salt Bush

Varnish Wattle A medium shrub that grows in well-drained light-to-heavy soils. Can withstand extended wet and dry periods. Will grow in dappled-

Hairy Wattle

Bull Oak

A dense small-to-medium shrub with yellow-brown flowers. Common plant of the outback, it is an important forage plant of dry regions. Grows best in heavy soils, in full-sun. Is a useful garden plant and for roadside planting. Frost and drought resistant. <u>1-3m x 2-4m. SG.</u>

Austrodanthonia duttoniana

Coarse grass, palatable and nutritious. Likes moist, poorly drained soils i.e.: depressions, drains. Seed heads appear early spring through to summer. Good ground cover and soil binder. Frost and drought hardy. <u>80 cm in height. SG.</u>

Banksia blechnifolia

Dwarf, spreading shrub that has horizontal branches. The flower heads are dusky-red to salmon colour with yellow tints. It is an adaptable and vigorous ornamental that grows in a range of well-drained soils. Drought hardy, likes full-sun, and tolerates medium frost. 0.2-0.5m x 2-4m. SG.

Banksia canei

Mountain Banksia

A medium, spreading shrub with pale yellow flowers in summer and autumn. Prefers heavy and clay soils and is frost resistant. Prefers full-partial-sun. <u>1-2.5m x 2-3m. SG</u>

Banksia coccinea

Scarlet Banksia

An outstanding ornamental Banksia. Requires well-drained, light to medium soils in partial or full-sun. Is hardy to moderate frosts and is drought tolerant. Flowers are scarlet in colour and are popular cut flowers. **3-5m x 2-4m. SG**

Banksia ericifolia

<u>Heath Banksia</u>

A very hardy and adaptable shrub. Popular for its graceful form and colourful orange-red flower spikes. A useful screen plant which birds find attractive. Will adapt to a variety of soils and aspects, prefers well-drained positions. Frost resistant. <u>2-7m x 3-6m. SG.</u>

Banksia integrifolia

Coastal Banksia

A sturdy tree with blunt-tipped leaves, silvery below. The flower heads are pale yellow. It grows well on heavy soils and is not affected by frost or wind. It prefers a sunny position and responds to watering during dry periods. **10-20m x 5-10m. SG.**

Banksia marginata

<u>Silver Banksia</u>

Variable from a low stunted shrub to a compact small tree. Grows well in a variety of soils. Frost resistant and can tolerate dry conditions. Pale yellow flowers appear in autumn. Ideal as a screen or wind break. <u>2-10m x 2-6m. SG.</u>

Banksia praemorsa

Cut-leaf Banksia

An outstanding ornamental, dense foliaged, upright, medium-to-tall shrub. Cylindrical flowers with a combination of deep red, purple, green and yellow. Likes well-drained soils and is adaptable to a range of climatic conditions. Frost tolerant, however flower heads may be damaged. <u>2-5m x 3-5m. SG.</u>

<u>Banksia spinulosa</u>

<u>Hairpin Banksia</u>

Very showy medium shrub, with a spreading form and bright yellow cone shaped flowers. Excellent for growing under eucalypts. Does not like high ph or limestone. Attractive to honeyeaters. Hardy in well-drained acidic soils. Frost and drought hardy. <u>1-4m x 1-5m. SG.</u>

Banksia spinulosa dwarf

<u>Dwarf Hairpin Banksia</u>

Very showy dwarf shrub with a spreading form and yellow to orange cone shaped flowers. Excellent for growing under eucalypts. Does not like high ph or limestone. Attractive to honeyeaters. Hardy in well-drained acidic soils. Frost and drought hardy. <u>CG.</u>

Billardiera scandens

Common Apple Berry

This climber is suited to a wide range of environments. It easily grows in full-sun or in dense shade and in sandy-to-clay soils. It prefers good drainage and enjoys some water in dry periods. Often seen climbing on trees as a vine, but becomes shrubby if planted in the open. Greenish-yellow bell-shaped flowers. Frost hardy. <u>1-5m x 2-3m. CG.</u>

Boronia megastigma

<u>Brown Boronia</u>

An upright, dense shrub with very fragrant bell-shaped flowers. Prefers moist, well-drained soils but will tolerate a wider range of conditions. Prefers partial shade and mulching around roots. Frost tolerant. <u>1-3m x 1-2m. CG.</u>

Brachychiton acerifolius

Flame Tree

A small-to-medium tree with bright red, bell-shaped flowers during summer prefers full to partial-sun. A very adaptable tree which tolerates a variety of climates and soils. A well known tree, which is widely cultivated throughout Australia. Frost tender when young. **10-40m x 10-15m. SG.**

Brachychiton populneus

Kurrajong

A very hardy, indigenous tree which is often found in very rocky sites but also extending along river banks and plains in a variety of soils. It is an excellent shade and shelter tree. Leaves can be used for stock fodder. Cream or pink flowers. Roots and seeds are suitable for bush tucker. Frost and drought hardy. <u>6-20m x 6-10m. SG.</u>

Brachyscome multifida

Rock Wall Daisy

Good compact, rockery plant which forms clumps, spreading by suckering. Soft finely-divided leaves. Mauve or lilac daisy flowers most of the year. Likes a sunny position and annual pruning. This plant is can become a very attractive ground cover in a short time. Frost resistant. 0.1-0.4m x 0.2-1m. CG.

Bulbine bulbosa

Bulbine Lily

A dwarf, perennial herb with bright green leaves to 40cm long. Bright, yellow flowers in spring. Likes moist well-drained soils with dappled shade to full-sun. Excellent plant for rockeries and container growing. Frost tolerant. 0.5-0.8m x 0.3m. SG.

Bursaria lasiophylla

Hairy Bursaria A small-to-medium shrub, found in rocky areas at higher altitudes. Likes well-drained soils and tolerates frost and snow. In spring it is covered in fragrant, white flowers. Bursaria's host insects which parasitise pasture grubs and other harmful insects. These plants attract birds and butterflies. 1-2.5m x 1-2.5m. SG.

Bursaria spinosa

Sweet Bursaria

Very hardy shrub with fragrant white flowers in spring. Will grow in most positions but dislikes waterlogging. Bursarias host insects which parasitise pasture grubs and other harmful insects. These plants attract birds and butterflies. Frost and drought hardy. 3-7m x 3-6m. SG.

Callistemon brachyandrus

Prickly Bottlebrush

Spreading shrub with red flowers from October to February. Excellent for hot areas and adaptable to most soils. Prefers full-sun. Good bird attractor. Frost hardy and drought tolerant. 1-5 m x 1-3 m. SG.

Callistemon citrinus

Crimson Bottlebrush

Wallum Bottlebrush

A good shrub for wet areas. Red bottle brush flowers in spring-autumn. Prune after flowering to maintain compactness. Attracts nectar feeding birds. Very hardy. Can have pendulous branches. Grows in a wide range of soils and tolerates frost. 2-8m x 2-6m. SG.

Callistemon pachyphyllus

A low-to-medium shrub flowering sporadically but with main flushes of red or green bottlebrushes in spring and autumn. Frost tolerant and adaptable to wet and dry conditions. Full-sun produces best flowers and pruning after flowering will help maintain good shape. Bird attracting. 2.5m x 1.5m. SG.

Callistemon pallidus

Lemon Bottlebrush

A dense medium-to-tall shrub with grey-green to green leaves. Grows in most soils in dappled shade to full-sun. Frost tolerant and withstands wind and waterlogging. Large cream to greenish yellow flowers. Good for windbreaks on farms. Attracts birds. 2-5m x 2-5m. SG.

Callistemon pityoides

Alpine Bottlebrush

(Formerly known as sieberi). Small shrub with yellow flower spikes. Adaptable to a wide range of soils and climates. Frost tolerant preferring moist soils and full or partial-sun. 1-5m x 1-5m. SG

Callistemon salignus

Willow Bottlebrush

Attractive foliage with cream or sometimes pink flower spikes. White, papery bark. Very hardy and drought tolerant. Grows well in most soils with adequate watering. 5-10m x 3-5m. SG.

Callistemon sieberi

River Bottlebrush

(Formerly known as paludosus) A shrub normally found along riverbanks and streams but will tolerate dry situations. Likes full-sun to semi-shade. Makes a good wind windbreak or screen for gardens or farms. Flowers are creamy pink. Frost hardy. 3-10m x 5-10m. SG.

Callistemon viminalis

A small shrub to small bushy tree with weeping branches. It has bright red flowers that are rich in nectar and attract birds. It is suited to most soils but likes water during dry spells. Maybe frost tender when small. Frost hardy when established. 1-12m x 1.5-6m. SG.

Callitris endlicheri

Black Cypress-Pine A hardy tree that thrives on the dry, rocky slopes of this area and tolerates poor soils. It is a suitable small tree for ornamental purposes in the garden or on the farm. Prefers good drainage and is frost and drought tolerant. A very attractive native pine. 5-20m x 3-8m. SG.

Callitris glaucophylla

White Cypress-Pine

A tree that has been widely used as an ornamental because of its upright growth and conical shape. Very popular because of its suitability as a specialty timber, which is dark and very durable (resistant to termites)? Well-drained sunny position. Frost and drought hardy.

5-20m x 5-15m. SG.

Calytrix tetragona

Fringe Myrtle

A medium, upright shrub with white-to-deep-pink star shaped flowers. Prefers well-drained soils but can handle a wide range of soils and climates. Frost and drought tolerant. Very attractive ornamental that prefers full-sun and responds well to light pruning after flowering. <u>1-4m x 1-2m. CG.</u>

Cassinia aculeata

<u>Dogwood</u>

A frost tolerant shrub that grows well in a wide range of soils. White and sometimes pink clusters of flowers. Frost tolerant. This shrub provides good haven for small birds and likes a light prune to keep it bushy. Frost tolerant. 2-4m x 1-2m. SG.

Cassinia arcuata

Drooping Cassinia

A graceful shrub with aromatic foliage. It will grow in most well-drained soils in full-sun to partial shade. Suitable for screening. It has fawn coloured flowers which are highly aromatic. Frost and drought tolerant. A good colonising plant for disturbed ground. **1-3m x 1-2m. SG**.

Cassinia longifolia

Shiny Cassinia

A large shrub to small tree. It will grow in well-drained moist soils, with dappled-shade or partial-sun. Tolerates frost and dense shade. Flowers form in dense clusters and are satiny-white. <u>3-6m x 2-4m. SG.</u>

Casuarina cunninghamiana

<u>River She-oak</u>

This tall, erect tree grows beside watercourses and is an excellent shade and shelter tree. It is tolerant of wetter soils. This fast-growing tree has dark red wood, which makes excellent timber. Frost hardy. <u>10-30m x 10-12m. SG.</u>

Casuarina glauca

Swamp She-oak

A conical or rounded tree with slightly pendulous branches. Adaptable to most soils with reasonable drainage. Has a tendency to sucker heavily. Prefers full-sun. Frost hardy. **8-20m x 5-10m. SG.**

Chamelaucium uncinatum

<u>Geraldton Wax – 'Purple Pride'</u>

This plant is highly prized as a cut flower and typical of most of the species. It prefers well-drained soils. It will tolerate light frosts and is drought tolerant. Likes dappled shade to full-sun. This spring flowering shrub has reddish-purple flowers in dense clusters. 2m x 2m. CG.

Chrysocephalum apiculatum

<u>'Merv's Tall' Form</u>

A low ground cover, with clusters of yellow, everlasting flowers. Prefers plenty of sunshine and the soils need to drain fairly freely. Tolerates light-to-moderate frosts and extended dry periods. Plants are very suitable for massed plantings or informal drifts. Highly recommended for containers Lovely grey – green, soft foliage. *0.5m x 1-3m. CG.*

Chrysocephalum semipapposum

<u>Clustered Everlasting</u>

An excellent ground cover plant. It is adaptable and tolerates a wide range of freely draining soil types. Full-sun or semi-shade is preferred, but tolerates dappled shade. Frost tolerant. If extended dry periods persist, stems usually die back and wait for optimum conditions before re-shooting. Clustered, yellow flowers contrast beautifully with the silver foliage. <u>0.5-1m x 0.6m. SG.</u>

Correa 'Dusky Bells'

Dwarf shrub with reddish, brown spreading branches. The tubular flowers are carmine pink. Great little plant for small gardens and rockeries. This plant grows in most soils and prefers dappled-shade or partial-sun. Frost and drought tolerant. <u>0.3m x 2-4m. CG.</u>

Correa glabra

Rock Correa

Dense, upright, rounded shrub which adapts to a wide range of soils. A useful garden plant with attractive green bell-shaped flowers in winter. It tolerates partial-shade but prefers full-sun. Frost and drought tolerant. <u>1-2m x 1-2m. CG.</u>

Correa lawrenciana

Varies from a dense, small shrub to an upright, small tree. Prefers medium-to-heavy soils. Frost tolerant. Cream, green or red tubular flowers. Ornamental plant, which serves well as screen. This plant is an excellent bird attracter. 2-8m x 2-5m. CG.

Correa backhousiana x Correa reflexa 'Marian's Marvel'

This hybrid correa has tubular flowers where the upper half is pale pink and the lower half is pale green. It is a compact, hardy small shrub suited to most well-drained conditions. It prefers dappled-shade or partial-sun. Frost tolerant. <u>1-2.5m x 1.5-3m. CG.</u>

Correa pulchella

An adaptable, prostrate to small shrub with many forms. Grows well in moist, well-drained light-to-heavy soils. Tolerates semi- shade to full-sun and extended dry periods. Flowers range from orange to pink to red. Frost tolerant. *Prostrate to 1m x 0.5-1.5m. CG.*

Correa reflexa

Dwarf Form

Dwarf shrub which has bell-shaped flowers. The flowers are red and green. Will grow in a range of conditions preferring well-drained, light-to-heavy soils with a preference for dappled-shade or partial-sun. Frost tolerant. <u>0.3m x 1-2m. CG.</u>

Correa reflexa

Common Correa

Prostrate to upright shrub which has bell-shaped flowers with different coloured tips. The flowers come in various colour combinations. Will grow in a range of conditions preferring well-drained, light-to-heavy soils with a preference for dappled-shade or partial-sun. Frost tolerant. *0.3-3m x 1-3m. CG*.

Correa reflexa

Upright shrub which has white bell-shaped flowers. Will grow in a range of conditions preferring well-drained, light-to-heavy soils with a preference for dappled shade or partial-sun. Frost tolerant. 1.5m x 2m. CG.

Correa reflexa

Upright shrub which has green, bell-shaped flowers. Will grow in a range of conditions preferring well-drained, light-to-heavy soils with a preference for dappled-shade or partial-sun. Frost tolerant. 1.5m x 2m. CG.

Craspedia globosa

Common Correa

Ornamental small shrub with profuse pink flowers, which have an extended display period. Will adapt to most soils and aspects and does best in dappled-shade or partial-sun. It is suitable for gardens or containers and flowers last in vases. Likes to be pruned lightly after flowering. Frost and drought tolerant. 0.6m x 0.5-1m. CG.

Drumsticks (See Pycnosorus globosus)

Daviesia latifolia

Hop Bitter-Pea

A medium shrub with pea-shaped yellow and brown flowers. Grows well in well-drained soils and prefers partial to full-sun. Frost hardy. Flowers have an attractive perfume. 1-3m x 1-2m. SG.

Daviesia ulicifolia

Gorse Bitter-Pea

Small, prickly shrub with orange - yellow pea-shaped flowers. Best suited to well-drained, light-to-medium soils. Prefers partial-sun. Can be pruned very hard to promote dense growth. Frost and drought hardy. 1-2m x 1-2m. SG.

Dianella tasmanica

Tasman Flax Lily Extra Dianella species. Tufted perennial herb with mauve/blue flowers. Best suited to moist, well-drained soils and prefers shade or partial-sun. This plant has very striking, large purple-lilac berries, which make a great show in summer. Hardy and grows well in containers. Frost hardy. 0.6-2m x 0.5-2m. SG.

Dillwynia sericea

Showy Parrot-Pea

Small, ornamental shrub with yellow and red, orange or pink pea-shaped flowers. Well-drained soils with partial to full-sun. Responds well to pruning. Frost tolerant and withstands extended dry periods. 0.6-1.5m x 1-2m. CG.

Dodonaea viscosa ssp angustissima Narrow-leaf Hop-Bush

A hardy shrub, although it is mostly found in dry, rocky areas with poor soil, it is quite adaptable providing drainage is fair. Attractive seed pods in early summer suitable for cutting. A neat, compact habit. Frost and drought tolerant. 1.5-5m x 1.5-4m. SG.

Dodonaea viscosa ssp cuneata

Wedge-leaf Hop-Bush

A wide spread, hardy shrub. Grows in most soils and is very suitable for cultivation providing there is good drainage. Frost and drought resistant. Very suitable for the garden with attractive seed pods suitable for cutting. 2-4m x 2-4m. SG.

Dryandra praemorsa

Cut-leaf Dryandra

A medium shrub with toothed-or-lobed dark green leaves with white undersides. This showy species likes well-drained soils with dappled-shade. It will cope with full-sun. Plants should be tip pruned regularly. Good yellowish or pink flowers for cutting. Frost and drought resistant. 2-3m x 2-3m. SG.

Eucalyptus albens

White Box

A hardy tree, great for stock shelter, firewood and timber. Attractive to nectar eating birds. Adaptable to most well-drained soils. Frost tolerant. Quick-growing. 15-25m x 10-15m. SG.

Eucalyptus blakelyi

Hill Gum

Medium-sized tree with wide spreading crown and pink or white flowers. Frost and drought tolerant and will grow in heavy loams and clays. Good for fire wood, fence posts and honey production. This red gum grows on inland slopes and adapts to many soil types. 5-20m x 10. SG.

Eucalyptus bridgesiana

Apple Box

A medium sized tree good for stock shelters, honey production and firewood. Frost and drought tolerant. Adaptable to most well-drained soils. Frost resistant. 10-18m x 5-15m. SG.

Eucalyptus caesia ssp magna

Silver Princess

Outstanding weeping, ornamental tree. Prefers good drainage and some shelter from strong winds. Has large pendant pink or red flowers and attractive silver branches. Prefers well-drained soils and is drought hardy. Tolerates clay-loams. Useful for honey production. Frost and drought resistant. 6-10m x 5-10m. SG.

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

River Red Gum

Large tree suitable for areas that suffer temporary inundation. Excellent for soil erosion control, stock shelters or ornamental purposes. Frost and drought tolerant. Adaptable to a wide range of soils and climates. Great refuge tree for birds, mammals and reptiles.

Green Flower Form

Common Correa White Flower Form

Eucalyptus camphora

Mountain Swamp Gum

A hardy tree that grows in high rainfall areas and often in moist wet situations as well as flats and valleys. Suitable for windbreaks and stock shelters. Frost hardy and will tolerate periods of dryness. 10-18m x 8-12m. SG.

Eucalyptus cinerea

Argyle Apple

An extremely ornamental tree found in the Wooragee area. It will grow in a wide range of soils and is frost and drought tolerant. A beautiful tree with appealing blue foliage. Suitable for use in landscaping. 8-18m x 8-15m. SG.

Eucalyptus citriodora

Lemon-scented Gum This medium-to-tall tree has a beautiful powdery-white trunk. Fragrant lemon-scented foliage when crushed. Frost tender when young. Useful for timber, essential oils and makes a handsome specimen tree in large gardens. Likes good drainage. 15-30m x 10-25m. SG.

Eucalyptus cladocalyx

Sugar Gum

Profuse white-to-cream flowers with smooth grey-to-bluish trunk, producing an aromatic honey. Very ornamental tree that is also good firewood and useful for building timber. Drought and semi-frost tolerant. 8-35m x 10-20m. SG.

Eucalyptus crenulata

Buxton Silver Gum

This is a very attractive small tree for moist-to-dry areas. Attractive foliage suitable for floristry. The flowers are prolific and attractive to nectar eating birds and insects. This guick-growing tree is hardy to frost and snow. 4m-12m. SG.

Eucalyptus dives

Broad-leaf Peppermint

Tree suitable for hill country and poor soil. Frost hardy and makes a good shade tree for stock. It will adapt to a wide range of soils and climates. Its bluish, juvenile foliage is quite attractive. Responds well to coppicing to produce cut foliage. 8-25m x 6-15m. SG.

Eucalyptus erythrocorys

An outstanding ornamental species with brilliant red buds, bright yellow flowers and contrasting green leaves. Grows well on welldrained, sandy loams. Can suffer damage from heavy frosts when young. Pruning will promote bushier growth. Needs plenty of sunshine. Moderately drought tolerant. 4-9m x 3-8m. SG.

Eucalyptus ficifolia

Flowering Gum

Red Cap Gum

A spreading, small to medium tree with a dense crown. The white - to-deep red or occasionally orange flowers are very showy. Grows well in a wide range of soil types. Plants are useful as windbreaks and respond well to regular pruning. Susceptible to frost. Drought tolerant. 6-15m x 5-20m. SG.

Eucalyptus forrestiana

Fuchsia Mallee

Medium-to-tall shrub or small tree with dense foliage. This attractive species has a pendulous yellow and red flower and is adaptable to a wide range of soils and climates. Commonly used in gardens, parks and acts as a good windbreak. Frost resistant. 3-7m x 3-10m. SG.

Eucalyptus globulus ssp bicostata

Eurabbie/Victorian Blue Gum

Large tree occurring mainly at higher altitudes, but is proving itself in the drier regions. Hardier tree than its Tasmanian cousins and is proving itself a hardy alternative for Agro-forestry. Frost hardy. 10-40m x 8-20m. SG.

Eucalyptus globulus ssp globulus Tasmanian Blue Gum

Upright medium-to-tall tree with white-to-cream flowers. The flowers produce good nectar and pollen yields. Grows best in well-drained heavy loams. Fast growing and is an excellent shade and shelter tree. Excellent for timber production with suitable rainfall. Frost hardy. 15-55m x 10-25m. SG.

Eucalyptus goniocalyx

Long-leaf Box

Small-to-medium tree with white to cream flowers. This tree is usually fast growing and provides good shade. It responds well to pruning and is best suited to temperate climates, growing in a wide range of acidic-to-neutral soils. Frost resistant. 8-20m x 6-15m. SG.

Eucalyptus lehmannii

Bushy Yate

Spreading medium-to-tall shrub with dense foliage. Flowers are light green forming globular heads to about 12 cm across, often profuse. This excellent ornamental species prefers well-drained soils and plenty of sunshine. Drought hardy and tolerates moderate frost. 2.5-5m x 4-5m. SG.

Eucalyptus leucoxylon rosea

Red Flowering Yellow Gum

Upright-to-spreading small tree with pink to reddish flowers about 3 cm across, often profuse. This is an attractive eucalypt, with a smooth-barked trunk and long flowering period. Moderately fast growing and excellent for shelter, shade and wind erosion control. Frost and drought resistant. 10-30m x 10-20m. SG.

Eucalyptus macrocarpa

Blue Bush

Ornamental medium sized mallee shrub, with bright red to pink red flowers. Drought tolerant and moderately frost resistant. Excellent bird attracting qualities. Foliage, flowers and fruit excellent for floral arrangements. Best in well-drained acidic to neutral soils with very good drainage. Needs plenty of sunshine and can be slow growing. <u>2-3m x 3-5m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus macrorhyncha

Red Stringybark

This medium-to-tall tree is useful for shade and produces a large volume of flowers which emit a strong honey scent. A good farm tree that tolerates frost and extended dry periods. Good for firewood and an excellent shade tree. <u>15-35m x 10-20m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus maculata

Spotted Gum

Medium-to-tall tree with strongly fragrant white flowers. Smooth cream bark with greyish blotches. Spotted gum is very ornamental and is best suited for large gardens or roadside plantations. The flowers attract nectar-eating birds. Fast growing and tolerant of most frosts. **20-30m x 10-20m. SG.**

Eucalyptus mannifera ssp mannifera Red Spotted Gum Beautiful tree suitable for most soils. This sub species is mainly found in NSW and has fairly broad leaves. Has lovely white bark, turning pink to bright red in early summer. Very frost tolerant and fast growing when young. Requires well-drained soils. 10-20m x 10-20m. SG.

Eucalyptus melliodora

Yellow Box

Found in North East Victoria, medium growth rate, good shade tree and honey production, flowers are white-to-cream, often profuse and sweetly scented. Open forests, loams on lower slopes, likes well-drained soils. Tolerates light-to-moderate frosts and hot dry summers. <u>10-30m x 8-25m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus microcarpa

<u>Grey Box</u>

Medium tree with white flowers. The flowers are rich in nectar and pollen and a good source of honey. Grey Box is highly regarded as a shade tree for stock and may be planted in windbreaks. Trees are hardy to dryness and will tolerate heavy frosts. <u>15-25m x 15-20m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus nicholii

Willow Peppermint

This is a widely planted tree and has proven itself to be very popular because of its hardiness and quick growth rate. This good ornamental is also suitable for windbreaks. Tolerant of frosts and wind. It has a spreading canopy of drooping, blue-green leaves. <u>12-16m x 10-15m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus pauciflora ssp pauciflora Snow Gum

Attractive, smooth-barked small-to-medium tree. Highly regarded for honey production. Tolerates light frost, sandy-to-clay soils. Suitable for areas of high wind and severe cold. A beautiful tree, worth the effort to grow. **<u>8-20m x 6-15m. SG.</u>**

Eucalyptus polyanthemos

Red Box

Produces tough durable timber for building. Excellent firewood. This tree attracts nectar eating birds. Will grow on well-drained poor soils. Tolerant of most droughts and frosts. Profuse cream flowers. Excellent for stock shade. <u>10-25m x 10-20m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus radiata

This medium-to-tall tree has a dense canopy with profuse white-to-cream flowers. Suitable for light construction timber, honey production, shade and shelter. Tolerates acidic-to-neutral soils and is hardy to most frosts and snowfalls. Highly aromatic leaves. **15-30m x 10-20m. SG.**

Narrow-leaf Peppermint

Eucalyptus rubida

<u>Candlebark</u>

A medium-to-tall tree with an erect habit. A very decorative hardy tree and excellent for shade. Ideal for districts that have very severe winters. Adaptable to most soils. The flowers are an important source of nectar and pollen for honey. Koalas inhabit this species. Frost hardy. <u>15-30m x 10-20m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus salmonophloia

<u>Salmon Gum</u>

This tall tree has attractive deciduous, brown bark that flakes to reveal pink coloured new bark in late summer and autumn. A slow growing species, with an extensive root system that needs plenty of space. Enjoys well-drained soil, frost and drought tolerant. **12-30m x 8-20m. SG.**

Eucalyptus scoparia

Wallangara White Gum

This is an extremely ornamental tree, prized for its white trunk and weeping habit. It likes most soils and conditions and is suitable for the larger garden. This tree is fast-growing and quickly develops a spreading crown. Very cold and frost hardy. <u>8-12m x 5-10m SG</u>

Eucalyptus sideroxylon

Ironbark

Medium-to-tall tree, with rough, dark bark and grey-green leaves. Flowers may be white, pink, red or pale yellow, often profuse and showy. Attractive to nectar eating birds and suitable for honey a+nd timber production. Fast growing and frost tolerant. Likes good drainage and tolerates drought. <u>10-30m x 10-20m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus sideroxylon ssp rosea Red-Flowering Ironbark

Medium-to-tall tree. Bark on trunk and main branches is deeply furrowed and reddish brown to black. Flowers red-to-pink. A valuable timber tree widely planted to attract nectar feeding birds. Frost and drought tolerant. <u>10-30m x 10-20m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus stellulata

This attractive tree is very adaptable to wet and moist conditions, useful for areas of soil erosion as well as shade and shelter. Valuable timber. Flowers white-to-cream, April – October. Tolerates wet and cold locations and most soil types. Frost hardy. <u>6-15m x 5-10m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus torquata

<u>Coral Gum</u>

This is a very ornamental tree. It has a very long flowering period and flowers as a young tree. It is quite adaptable and will grow in many regions of this country. They are drought tolerant and frost hardy. Flowers range from white, pink, cream to red and are cultivated in Israel as cut flowers. <u>6-12m x 5-10m. SG.</u>

Eucalyptus viminalis

Manna Gum

This large, handsome tree grows in cooler, higher altitude areas in the North East. It reaches its full height potential, 50 metres, in high rainfall areas. The pink/yellow, straight-grained timber is used for buildings, flooring and joinery. Excellent food for koalas and important nectar and pollen source. Frost hardy. <u>10-50m x 8-15m. SG.</u>

Eutaxia microphylla

Prostrate-to-dwarf shrub with decorative yellow and reddish, pea-shaped flowers. This groundcover grows in sandy loams-to-heavy, clay loams that are sometimes subject to waterlogging. It is tolerant of a wide range of soils. It will grow in full shade but does better in dappled-shade to full-sun. Withstands extended dry periods and frosts. Good for containers and responds well to pruning. <u>0.05-0.3m x 0.5-1.5m. SG.</u>

Grevillea alpina

Cat's Claw – Red/Yellow, Red, or Yellow Flowered Varieties available

Hardy, indigenous, bird-attracting shrub. Will tolerate a range of well-drained soils. Full-sun or semi-shade. Flowers throughout the year with a spectacular flush in spring. Suitable for the garden and in revegetation plantings. Tolerant of frosts and extended dry periods. 0.2-4m x 0.5-3m. CG.

Grevillea arenaria

Medium shrub with bird-attracting green or red-to-pink flowers during spring. Tolerates a variety of climates. Plants grow in most welldrained to fairly well-drained acidic soils. Does well in shaded, semi-shaded or sunny sites. Frost tolerant and withstands extended dry periods. <u>1.5-3m x 2-3m. CG.</u>

Grevillea "Bronze Rambler"

A prostrate, spreading shrub to 60cm high by 3 to 5 metres wide with deeply lobed leaves and bronze new growth. Reddish-purple flowers are produced from August to March. Frost resistant and suitable for open to semi-shaded positions. A fairly well-drained soil and tolerates short periods of water logging. *Prostrate to 0.5m x 3-5m. CG.*

Grevillea confertifolia

Small shrub with prickly foliage. Tolerates frost and dry conditions with best results in full-sun to semi-shade. Spectacular when in bloom, producing profuse pink-to-mauve flowers. **0.4m x 1.5m. CG.**

Grevillea curviloba

A vigorous, dense, spreading shrub. Can be used as a ground cover but will send up erect, floral branches. Attractive, profuse cream flowers in spring. Will withstand frost and dry periods - provided there is adequate soil moisture. Enjoys full-sun and well-drained soil. <u>1-2.5m x 2.5-5m. CG.</u>

Grevillea fililoba

<u>Ellendale Pool</u>

A spreading, dense, soft shrub with delicate foliage and pink-to-bright-red, showy flowers. Moderately adaptable plant that tolerates cool-wet to hot-dry climates. Prefers a warm sunny position in well-drained soils. Hardy to frost. <u>1.5m x 3m. CG.</u>

Grevillea iaspicula

Wee Jasper Grevillea

An attractive, compact shrub with red and cream flowers for most for the year. Enjoys well-drained soil and a sunny position, will tolerate heavy frost and dry summers. *2m x 2m. CG.*

Grevillea jephcottii

Green Grevillea

A hardy and adaptable species. Tolerates a wide range of conditions. It adapts very well to most acidic soil types and does not mind extended wet periods. One of the best Grevilleas for attracting birds, as the flowering plants are constantly visited by nectar feeding birds. Excellent for semi-shaded sites and growing under taller plants. Useful for screening and hedging Regular tip pruning will maintain density. Frost and drought hardy. <u>2-3m x 2-4m. CG</u>

Grevillea juniperina

<u>Juniper Gr</u>evillea

Dwarf-to-medium shrub with cream, yellow to red flowers. Prefers well-drained, acidic to slightly alkaline soils in a sunny position. Will tolerate dappled or semi-shade and extended periods of wetness. Responds well to pruning. Attracts bird life. Frost and drought resistant. *Prostrate 1m x 1.5-4m. CG.*

Grevillea lanigera

Woolly Grevillea

A dwarf shrub that has soft, grevish-green leaves and profuse flowers coloured reddish-pink and cream. Adapts to most soils and hardy to frosts and extended dry periods. Likes sunny or semi-shade sites. Responds well to pruning. Attracts bird life. Prostrate x 1.5. CG.

Grevillea 'Ned Kelly'

A medium shrub with large, peach-to-pink flowers. Will tolerate frost and dry periods and adapts to most soils. Enjoys partial shade. 2m x 3m. CG.

Grevillea obtusifolia

A prostrate shrub with bright pink or red flowers. A very hardy species that adapts to hot-dry or cold-wet conditions. Valued for its bright green foliage and dense, ground covering habit. Frost and drought hardy. Prostrate x 2-5m. CG.

Grevillea 'Poorinda Royal Mantle'

A vigorous, prostrate groundcover. Suitable for both sunny and semi-shaded positions. Prefers a well-drained site in clay loam-to-sand or gravel. Frost resistant. 3-6m width. CG.

Grevillea rhyolitica

Deua Grevillea

A small shrub with lovely green foliage and bright red flowers. Hardy to frost and limited dry periods. A great ornamental garden species. 1.5m x 1.5m. CG.

Grevillea robusta

Silky Oak

Small-to-medium tree with orange-yellow flowers rich in nectar. Hardy tree and will adapt to many climates and soil types. Grows well in a sunny position. Useful as a timber tree. Attracts nectar feeding birds. Susceptible to frost. 10-30m x 5-20m. SG.

Grevillea rosmarinifolia

Rosemary Grevillea A very hardy dwarf-to-medium shrub with pink or reddish flowers. Prefers good drainage in a partial to full-sun position. Responds well to pruning and is excellent for ornamental planting in gardens. Attracts bird life. Tolerant of frosts and extended dry periods. 0.3m-3m x 1-5m. CG.

Grevillea rosmarinifolia

'Scarlet Sprite'

This form of Grevillea rosmarinifolia has very narrow, green leaves and is covered with red flowers. Prefers good drainage in a partial to full-sun position. Responds well to pruning and is excellent for ornamental planting in gardens. Attracts bird life. Tolerant of frosts and extended dry periods. 1-2m x 2-3m. CG.

Grevillea sericea

An appealing shrub with delicate pink flowers which are often profuse and conspicuous. Plants adapt well most acidic soil types and prefer some shade growing well in dappled-shade but also tolerating a fair amount of sunshine. Tolerates frost and extended periods of dryness. 1.5-3m x 1-3m. CG.

Grevillea

'White Wings'

A hybrid Grevillea that is dense and slightly prickly with white flowers. An extremely vigorous plant which adapts to a wide range of acidic-to-slightly-alkaline soil types. They grow well in full-sun, or in a sheltered semi-shaded site. Frost tolerant. Plants are excellent for screening and controlling foot traffic and a refuge for small birds. 3m x 3m. CG.

Hakea bucculenta

Red Hot Pokers

A medium sized, bushy shrub with spectacular red flowers that are enjoyed by nectar feeding birds. Recommended for dry regions, this species is hardy to frosts and will withstand extended dry periods. 3-5m x 3-6m. SG.

Hakea decurrens

Small-to-medium shrub with white flowers. Plants will adapt to a range of soil types but need good drainage. Hardy to most frosts and droughts. Useful for low-screening. 1-4m x 1-3m. SG.

Hakea eriantha

Tree Hakea

A useful, reliable and long-living shrub. Will grow in most well-drained situations with full-sun or semi-shade. Suitable for hedging and screening. Flowers cream, white or pink. Frost and drought tolerant. 2-8m x 3-6m. SG.

Hakea laurina

Pincushion Hakea

Medium-to-tall shrub-or small tree with red and cream flowers. Best grown in well-drained soils in a sunny position. Susceptible to heavy frosts. Useful for wind breaks and screening purposes. 3.5-8m x 3-10m. SG.

Hakea petiolaris

Sea Urchin Hakea

A medium to tall shrub or small tree, this plant has green to pink and pale green flowers that age to cream and maroon and sometimes to pale orange. Likes freely-draining soils and plenty of sun. Good for nectar eating birds. Excellent ornamental plant. Frost and drought tolerant, but heavy frost will damage young growth. 4-10m x 2-6m. SG.

Hakea sericea

Bushy Needlewood

Bushy shrub with scented, pink flowers and wrinkled nut-like fruits. Native to heaths and open forests. Its prickly foliage is good refuge for birds. Grows in a wide range of soils and copes with shade or full-sun. Frost tolerant. 3-7m x 3-6m. SG.

Hardenbergia violacea

Australian native evergreen climber with twining stems. Purple pea-shaped flowers. Large, green leaves. Very hardy, withstands frost. Tolerates dry conditions and full-sun or semi-shade. This plant may be used well as a groundcover on embankments. Frost resistant. Climber or trailer. 1-1.5m x 2-6m. SG.

Sarsaparilla/Purple Coral Pea

Hardenbergia violacea ssp alba

White Sarsaparilla White flowered climber or scrambling creeper. Frost resistant. Can spread to 5m and climb to 2m. SG.

Hypocalymma xanthopetalum

Dwarf-to-small shrub with profuse, fragrant, yellow flowers. Adapts well to most freely-draining soil types. Enjoys sun but will tolerate dappled-shade and light frosts. Hardy to lengthy dry periods. 0.5m-1.5m x 1m-1.5m. CG.

Indigofera australis

Austral Indigo

A medium shrub with pea-shaped pink flowers. Will adapt to most acidic soil types and prefers partial-sun. Frost tolerant and early tip pruning will promote bushy growth. 1.5-3m x 1-3m. SG.

Kennedia prostrata

Running Postman

A spreading creeper or trailer with excellent scarlet red, pea-shaped flowers. Adaptable to a wide range of soils and climatic conditions, prefers well-drained soils but will tolerate temporary inundation. Frost and drought hardy plant that likes sun. Prostrate x 1.5m-3 CG.

Kunzea ericoides

Burgan Tea Tree A hardy shrub found in a range of soils usually moist-to-waterlogged for lengthy periods. These plants will adapt to other areas providing they are kept moist. They prefer dappled-shade but will grow in full-sun. Flowers are scented and creamy white in summer. Hardy to heavy frosts. 2-8m x 2-5m. SG.

Kunzea parvifolia

Violet Kunzea

A dwarf-to-medium shrub with pink to violet flowers. It adapts to a wide range of soils and climatic conditions, although it usually grows in well-drained rocky or sandy soils. Likes sun or semi-shade and hardy to most frosts. Suitable for hedging. 0.5-2.5m x 1-3m. SG.

Leptospermum brevipes

Slender Tea-tree

Medium shrub with foliage which is suitable for cut and dry flower arrangements. Will grow in poor, rocky soils and will also adapt to a range of soils and locations. Can tolerate most frosts and limited drought. Full or filtered sun. 2-7m x 2-6m. SG.

Leptospermum continentale

Prickly Tea-tree

Small-to-tall shrub with prickly, stiff leaves. It grows on a variety of soils. Useful on waterlogged sites. Hardy to frosts and drought. Sunny sites or semi-shade. Profuse, scented flowers in spring. This plant is an excellent refuge for small birds. 1-4m x 1-3m. SG.

Leptospermum grandifolium

Mountain Tea-tree

Medium shrub-to-small tree that grows in swampy or sandy soils and along water courses. Tolerant of full-sun or semi-shade and frost hardy. Very useful for screens and for stream bank stabilisation. 1-7m x 1-5m. SG.

Leptospermum lanigerum

Woolly Tea-tree

Medium shrub-to-small tree with profuse, white, sweetly-scented flowers. Tolerant of moist soils in full-sun or semi-shade. Hardy to most frosts. Valuable for streamside regeneration and for swamps. 2-8m x 1.5-5m. SG.

Leptospermum obovatum

River Tea-tree An indigenous shrub that will tolerate most situations. From light-to-heavy soils and from sun to semi-shade. Will tolerate dry spells but appreciates some watering. Good for streams or swamps. They respond to pruning or clipping. The flowers are white. Hardy to most frosts. 2-8m x 1.5-5m. SG.

Leptospermum petersonii

Lemon-scented Tea-tree

Tall shrub with lemon scented foliage and white flowers up to 1.5cm across. Will grow on a wide range of soils. Leaves contain essential oils and can be used as a tea, imparting a lemon tang. Useful for screens, windbreaks and hedges. Frost tolerant when mature, but heavy frost can damage young plants. 3-5m x 2-5m. SG.

Leptospermum rotundifolium

Round-leaf Tea-tree 'Lavender Queen' A low shrub with lavender flowers. Adapts to a wide range of soils and climatic conditions. It does best in a sunny site but tolerates semi-shade. Hardy to frost and dry periods this is an ornamental species that is excellent for cut flowers. 1-2m x 1.5-3m. CG.

Melaleuca coccinea

Goldfields Bottlebrush

Small-to-medium shrub with bright red flowers. Needs a well-drained sunny site. Responds well to pruning. Hardy to most frosts and extended dry periods. 1-2.5m x 1-3m. SG.

Melaleuca ericifolia

Swamp Paperbark

Tall shrub-to-small tree with cream, scented flowers in Spring. An excellent plant for seepage areas and swampy sites. Frost hardy. This vigorous plant should be planted with caution, as it may dominate wetter gardens. 6-12m x 4-8m. SG.

Melaleuca fulgens

Scarlet Honey-Myrtle

Small-to-medium shrub with profuse flowers that can be apricot through to scarlet. Very attractive, needs full-sun and good drainage for best results. Hardy to frost and drought. Bird attractor. 1-3m x 1.5-3m. SG.

Melaleuca lateritia

Robin Red-breast Bush

Snow in Summer

Prickly Paperbark

Bright orange-red bottlebrush flowers well displayed in the sparsely foliaged evergreen medium shrub. Narrow leaves. Summer and Autumn flowering. Tolerates hot, dry conditions. Frost tolerant and withstands extended dry periods. Attracts nectar eating birds. 1.5-2.5m x 1-3m. SG.

Melaleuca linariifolia

A shapely, bushy tree with attractive foliage and lovely paperbark trunk. Blooms in early summer with a conspicuous mantle of white flowers. Natural distribution along stream banks and swamp margins. Hardy to most droughts and frosts.. 6-10m x 3-8m. SG.

Melaleuca styphelioides

Medium tree, with white flowers. Will grow in a wide range of soils. Frost tolerant. A handsome tree, with an erect, bushy habit. An excellent refuge plant for wildlife. 10-20m x 8-15m. SG.

Melicytus dentatus

Tree Violet

Tall, prickly shrub with small, fragrant, tubular yellow flowers. Will grow in a wide range of soils which have adequate drainage. Prefers a sunny aspect. Frost tolerant. Responds well to pruning and can be used for hedging. Its good perfume makes it suitable for planting near the house. 2-4m x 1-3m. SG.

Micromyrtus ciliata

Fringed Heath-Myrtle

A beautifully formed, domed shrub with slightly, pendulous branches. Profuse white flowers which give a continuous display from spring to early summer. Suitable for rockeries and containers. Prefers well-drained acidic sandy loams with a sunny aspect. Plants tolerate most frosts and once established, withstand extended dry periods. 0.6-1.m x 1m-1.5m. CG.

Mirbelia oxyloboides

Mountain Mirbelia

Ornamental shrub with fragrant pea-shaped yellow and orange flowers. Likes well-drained light to moderately heavy, acidic soils with full-sun or partial shade. A species that is frost hardy and withstands extended dry periods. Responds well to light pruning. Attracts butterflies. 1.5-2.5m x 1-3m. SG.

Myoporum parvifolium

Creeping Boobialla White and Pink flowering forms A dwarf shrub with green to purplish leaves and white or pink flowers. A vigorous adaptable groundcover that prefers a sunny site but will tolerate partial shade. Great for embankments and clay sites. Frost and drought resistant. Prostrate x 1.5-5m . CG.

Olearia phlogopappa

Dusty Daisy Bush

Small shrub with a daisy-like white to purple flowers with yellow centres. Prefers a semi-shaded site with freely-drained, moist soils. Quick-growing and responds well to regular pruning. Frost hardy. 1-2.5m x 1-2.5m. CG.

Philotheca myoporoides

Long-leaf Wax Flower

Small-to-tall shrub with profuse, white flowers, commencing from a pink bud. Hardy and adaptable. Prefers good drainage and partialsun. Frost resistant. Responds well to pruning. A highly valuable, flowering plant, suited to most gardens. 1.5-5m x 1.5-3m. CG.

Philotheca "Profusion"

Wax Flower A medium shrub with white flowers. Enjoys most soil types and full-sun. Moderately frost tolerant and will withstand dry periods. 2m x 2m. CG.

Platylobium formosum

Handsome Flat-Pea

Dwarf-to-medium shrub with yellow-to-orange pea-shaped flowers. Adapts well to acidic soils in full-sun but prefers semi-shade. Frost and drought hardy. Butterflies are greatly attracted to this plant. 0.5-1m x 1-2m. CG.

Poa labillardieri

Tall Tussock Grass Tufted perennial grass. Grows well in massed planting and needs acidic soils for best results. Prefers semi-shade or full-sun. Frost and drought hardy. 0.5-1.3m x 0.5-1.5m. SG

Pomaderris aspera

Hazel Pomaderris

Medium-to-tall shrub or small tree with cream-to-green flowers. Quick growing species which prefers semi-shade. Adapts to a range of acidic soils. Frost hardy. This species is a larval host for the Jewell Butterfly. 3-12m x 3-5m. SG.

Prostanthera aspalathoides

Scarlet Mint-Bush An aromatic, small shrub with bright red flowers. Enjoys a sunny spot and sand-to-loam soils that are well-drained. Hardy to most frosts and attracts nectar feeding birds when in flower. 0.5-1m x 0.5-1m. CG.

Prostanthera lasianthos

Victorian Christmas Bush

Medium shrub with white flowers in summer. Prefers full or partial-sun. Adapts to a range of soils. Fast growing and useful as a screen plant or hedge. Frost tolerant. 2-5m x 3-5m. CG.

Prostanthera rotundifolium

Round-leaved Mint-Bush

Dwarf-to-medium aromatic shrub. Needs at least moderately well-drained acidic soils. A semi-shaded site is recommended. Frost hardy and tolerates limited periods of dryness. 2-4m x 2-4m. CG.

Pultenaea foliolosa

Small-leaf Bush-Pea

Hairy shrub with yellow and orange or red flowers. Requires well-drained acidic soils with a sunny or semi-shaded aspect. Plants tolerate most frosts and extended dry periods. 0.5-1m x 1-2m. CG.

Pultenaea lapidosa

Stony Bush-Pea

Dwarf-to-small shrub with hairy young growth. Needs freely-draining acidic soils and does best in a semi-shaded site. Tolerant of light to moderately-heavy frosts. 0.5-1m x 1-1.5. SG.

Pultenaea laxiflora

Loose-Flower Bush-Pea

This is a wide-spread small shrub. The flowers are pea-shaped and are orange and red. A low, spreading shrub it will tolerate most soils providing it is well-drained. It is frost and drought tolerant. Sun to semi-shade. 0.3m x 0.6m. CG.

Pycnosorus globosus

Drumsticks

A grey-leaved perennial with tall, globular, bright yellow flowers. Likes well-drained soils in partial to full-sun. This little plant is frost tolerant and makes an excellent rockery plant and is good for containers. 0.3-1.2m x 0.5-0.8m. SG.

Stylidium graminifolium

Grass Triggerplant

Perennial herb with grass-like leaves to 40cm. Pink-to-magenta flowers from August to November. Locally common in the North East. Grows in sandy or gravely soils and prefers a well-drained sunny position. Excellent small rockery plant with beautiful flowers. Frost hardy. 0.4-0.8m x 0.5m. SG.

Telopea speciosissima

<u>New South Wales Waratah (Floral Emblem of New South Wales)</u>

A striking plant when in flower. Excellent drainage is essential. Full-sun to partial shade. Prune after flowering to allow good flower production the following year. Frost hardy and bird-attracting. 2-3m x 2-4m. SG.

Thryptomene calycina

Dense, rounded shrub with dark green leaves and profuse white flowers in winter and spring. Useful as cut flowers and foliage. Prefers good drainage with full-sun to semi-shade. Frost hardy. 3m x 2m. CG.

Thryptomene saxicola

Open, slightly pendulous shrub with pale pink flowers in winter and spring. Useful as cut flowers and foliage. Prefers good drainage with full-sun to semi-shade. Moderately frost and drought hardy. 1-2m x 2-4m. CG.

Viminaria juncea

Golden Spray

Tall shrub, occurring in swampy ground with pendulous, leafless branches and sprays of yellow, pea-like flowers in Spring. Prefers moist soils and full-sun. Suitable for poorly drained areas. Frost hardy. Up to 4-6m x 3-5m. SG.

Westringia fruticosa

Coastal Rosemary

Very hardy shrub which will adapt to most situations. Suitable for hedging and screens. White flowers most of the year. Can tolerate a wide range of growing conditions. Frost and drought hardy. 0.3-2m x 1-4m. CG.

Westringia glabra

Violet Westringia

An upright, bushy shrub with mauve flowers over a long period in spring. Responds well to pruning, enjoys part-shade. Can be variable in height, a good hedge or screen. Frost resistant. 1-2m x 1-2m. CG.

Westringia 'Wynyabbie Gem'

This Westringia is a hybrid of westringia fruticosa and westringia eremicola. It is hardy, compact and has blue-mauve flowers throughout the year. Requires full-sun and is adaptable to most soils. Frost and drought resistant. 1.5-3m x 1.5-3m. CG.

Xerochrysum bracteatum

Golden Everlasting/Paper Daisy

Annual, biennial or perennial herb, dwarf shrub. Flower heads 2-8 cm across, white-to-cream, yellow-to-golden yellow and pink-toburgundy flowers. Prefer open, sunny location with well-drained soil, although partial-sun can be successful. Attracts butterflies. Prune regularly. Frost and drought tolerant, Prostrate to 1.5m x 0.5-1.5m. SG.

Water Species

Plants for wet and boggy areas

Carex appressa

Tall Sedge

This is a wide-spread indigenous tussocky sedge that is suitable for boggy positions and suitable as an aquatic plant for the edge of a pond. It prefers full-sun. Frost hardy. 0.5-0.8m tall.

Carex fascicularis

Tassell Sedge

Slowly spreading tussock . Found in swampy areas or along stream banks, or among boulders in the stream bed. Ideal for planting around the margins of ponds or dams where the roots are wet. Very decorative when in flower, or fruit. Frost hardy. 0.5-1.0m tall.

Juncus ingens

Giant Rush

Medium perennial, semi-aquatic herb with a brownish flower. Requires moist soil for best growth. Prefers partial-sun. Valuable for embankment stabilization beside rivers, creeks and pools but not recommended for small sites. Frost hardy. <u>2-4.5m x 1-3m</u>.

Lomandra longifolia

Spiny-headed Mat-rush

Perennial herb forming a dense tussock with cream-to-yellow flowers. Hardy plant which is adaptable to most soils. Prefers a sunny position. An excellent plant for containers. Hardy to most frosts. <u>0.5m-1m x 1-2m</u>.

Phragmites australis

Common Reed

Vigorous growing bamboo-like perennial. Grows on margins of ponds, pools and waterways, in water up to 2 metres deep. Grows best in a sunny position. Suitable for erosion control, water filtration and an excellent refuge for birds. Frost hardy and will tolerate seasonal dryness and low salinity. <u>2-3m x 2-5m</u>.

Hibbertia obtusifolia

<u>Hoary Guinea Flower</u>

Dwarf shrub with showy, profuse yellow flowers. Prefers well-drained soils with filtered sun. Excellent plant for containers. The bright yellow flowers make a good rockery display. Tolerates frosts. *0.1-1m x 0.1-0.5m. CG.*

Pimelea humilis

Common Rice-flower

This species often develops as a pleasing, lightly suckering plant. Adapts to a variety of soil types that need to drain moderately well and a sunny or semi-shaded site. May be planted under shrubs, also in rockeries, borders and containers. Plants are hardy to most frosts and extended dry periods. <u>0.2-0.5m x 0.4-1.2m. SG</u>

Pimelea linifolia

Slender Rice-flower

A dwarf-to-medium shrub with reddish branchlets and profuse, pink, white or sometimes yellow flowers. Prefers good drainage and a semi-shaded site but will tolerate full-sun. Responds well to pruning and makes a good container plant. Hardy to most frosts. *0.1-1.5m x 0.3-1.5m. SG.*

Xanthorrhoea glauca ssp angustifolia Grey Grass Tree

The grass tree is very much a part of the Australian landscape. Slow-growing it will take many years to form a trunk and to form the spear-like flower. Needs a well-drained, sunny position. Frost and drought hardy. <u>3m x 1.2-3m. SG.</u>

Xanthorrhoea minor ssp lutea

Small Grass Tree

Small plant with spear-like flowers. The stem is subterranean, with branching occurring underground. A slow-growing plant, which needs a well-drained sunny position. Recommended for its foliage. Attracts bird life. Frost and drought hardy. <u>30-60cm. SG.</u>
